# SECTION A

 Social inequality refers to differences between people in terms of opportunities and rewards. For example, people vary in terms of money, status and power. When people are ranked hierarchically according to their possession of attributes such as income, wealth, power, age, gender and status, this is known as "social stratifications".

Sociologists suggest that the origins of inequality can be found in the culture and social structures of societies. This is not to deny that there are innate and natural differences between people and that such difference contribute to social inequality. However, the sociological approach emphasizes how cultures and social structures can create and maintain individual inequalities.

Social inequality and stratification greatly affect the quality of peoples lives. It can make the difference between, for example, working in a well paid job or being unemployed, eating well or going hungry, enjoying good health and living to an old age or dying young.

- (c) Explain how peoples chances of enjoying good health and living to an old age may be influenced by social inequality. [10 marks]
