- (a) **Bible as God's word**
  - Bible authors wrote under influence of the Holy Spirit
  - God is the author of the Bible. Wrote the ten laws
  - Contains true message of God for daily living
  - Deals with God's revelation to human beings
  - Talks about God's nature
  - Talks about Jesus Christ God's son
  - Has prophecies which came to pass
  - Has words of prophets who were God's messengers
  
- (b) **Similarities in creation stories**
  - Both male and female were created
  - Both God is the sole creator
  - Both marriage was God ordained
  - Both man was given responsibility
  - Both everything created was for man's benefit
  - Both man is portrayed as superior to other creatures
  - Both God is the source of life
  
- (c) **Conditions for the renewal of Sinai Covenant**
  - Not to intermarry with foreigners.
  - To keep the Sabbath day holy
  - To keep the feast of the Passover
  - Not to worship any idol gods
  - Not to make treaties with other notices
  - To obey God's commandments
  - To breakdown altars of idols in Canaan
  - Dedicate their first born sons as well as those of their domestic slaves to God.

  - He honoured and obeyed God
  - Established a strong military army
  - Captured Jerusalem from Jebusites
  - Established good international relations with neighboring states
  - Improved economic status of Israel through trade.
  - He expanded territorial boundaries of Israel
  - He was chosen by god
  - He had outstanding leadership qualities
  - He composed psalms used in worship
  - He consulted and obeyed God's servants
