  - (ii) He baptized people as assign of changing their way of life in preparation for the messiah.

  - (iv) He encouraged the rich to share with the needy.
  - (v) He warned the people of God's punishment on sin.
  - (vi) He advised tax collectors to be just and fair in their dealings.

- (i) Education was given to the youth in order to instill discipline and responsibility.
- (ii) Were sensitized on the consequences of irresponsible sexual bahaviour
- (iii) Virginity was valued and rewarded in marriage.
- (iv) Pregnancy before marriage is severely punished.
- (v) Those found to have impregnated a girl is reprimanded.
- (vi) Mothers are held responsible over their daughters conduct.
- (vii) Occasions such as dances were supervised to prevent young people from mis behaviour
- (viii) Mixing of boys and girls is restricted.
- (ix) Whole community was concerned with the moral integrity of the youths.
- (x) Youths were taught to respect each other.
- (xi) Adult were to be role model to the youth not to have extra-marital sex.
- (xii) Charity was encouraged and a must after initiation. (1x7 = 7 marks)

#### (b) Identify Biblical teachings on celibacy as alternative to marriage. (7mks)

- (vii) Celibacy is a covenant marked by Vows before one is ordained to the vocation.
- (viii)In old Testament prophets like Jeremiah was commanded not to marry but be used by God for divine purpose.
- (ix)According to (1cor 7: 32-34) Paul's sees marriage to divide interests of a person to serve God.
- (x)Celibacy makes one be married to Christ and finds no room to enter into human relationship.
- (xi)Paul recommends one to remain un married, if you can control your sexual desires (1 Cor:7:32-38). (1x7 = 7 marks)
