



They say that a journey of a thousand miles begins with one step. Just a step and that's how I start my morning everyday. Hoping for the best. You see, I have sickle cell anaemia, an inherited chronic disease in which red blood cells are crescent-shaped instead of round. These rigid, sticky cells can get stuck in small blood vessels, which can slow or block blood flow and oxygen to other parts of the body. This makes it difficult for the cells to deliver enough oxygen to the body, causing chronic anaemia and episodes of extreme pain. Normally, the flexible, round blood cells move easily through blood vessels.

It affects mainly people of Africa descent and is more common in West and East Africa. It cannot be transferred by touch. Both parents have to have the genes (but not necessarily the condition) to pass it on to their child. It is incurable. There's normally no cure for most people with sickle cell, but treatments that can relieve pain and help prevent complications associated with the diseases can be offered.

Signs of anaemia show up around five months of ages and these includes vision problems, delayed growth or puberty, frequent infections, swelling of feet and hands, periodic episodes of pain and anaemia. Treatment include medication to reduce pain and prevent complications, blood transfusions and supplementations and in extreme cases bone marrow transplants.

An attack on the body is called sickle crists and it is when you are in extreme pain in your joint, arms and legs. This condition requires frequent hospitalization. It also requires taking medicine everyday of your life, sometimes I feel like giving up.

Living with sickle cell proves quite a challenge. I struggled with people's prejudices when they found out that I had sickle cell anaemia. They give you the ooh-aah treatment, then stop inviting you to their places because they think you'll drop dead. They look and talk to you differently. It comes with stigma.

Whenever I thought of who I was, the one with this condition, I would put a strain on myself, so I stopped I learnt that I am not who I am and because of the sickle cess, I work twice as hard to prove myself. My mother once told me, "I have faith that you'll get better, but if you do not have your own faith, then my faith can not save you" It jolted me. I realised then that I may be a sickling, but I am also a daughter, a friend and a sister.

I have come this far with God's grace and the support of my family, more so, my mother and friends. I can go much further.
