1a) Give eight reasons for studying CRE (8mks)

- To get better understanding of God
- To enable the learner to use the knowledge and attitude to think critically and make appropriate decisions
- To appreciate your religion and that of others
- To acquire principles of Christian living of knowing Jesus
- To help promote/develop a sense of self worth and identity and that of others
- To help international consciousness
- To enable us live new lives in Christ Jesus
- To help form a bridge for further studies and career development
- To identify answers to some life's questions and mysteries e.g. why do people die

- Through the words written in it we hear to us
- It contains words spoken by God e.g. thus says the lordEzekiel 35:10
- It talks about God how he created and how he reveals him self to prophets
- Through the bible we know what does how he acts, his nature and character
- Through faith we accept the bible as the word of God
- It contains the history of human salvation through Jesus Christ
- It contains the prophecies by Gods prophets which came to pass

- It is used in preaching/teaching by pasters, priests and lay leaders

2a) Describe the second account of creation (Genesis2:4-23)

- God molded man from soil and breathed into his nostrils
- God planted the garden of Eden
- Out of the ground the lord God made to grow every tree that is pleasant and good
- The garden of Eden was watered by four rivers; Pishon, Gishon, Euphrates, Tigris
- God put man in the garden of Eden to till it
- Man could eat from all the trees except from the tree of knowledge lest he die
- God created the woman from mans ribs to be his companion
- God then instituted and blessed marriage between man and woman

- The perfect relationship between God and man was damaged
- People will have toil struggle and sweat to meet their needs
- The earth itself is under a curse
- There is enemity between man and wild animals
- Death sentence was passed on all people
- Murderers feelings began to enter people
- Human beings changed and became prone to sin
- The life span of man was reduced
- God felt neglet for having created human beings
- God confused human languages

b) Mention the causes of evil in the traditional African society (7mks)

- Evil people like witches, wizards and sorcerers
- Malicious ancestral spirits
- Breaking of taboos
- Curses by parents and other relatives like aunts, uncles e.t.c
- Bad omen of certain acts, words or things could cause harm

- Natural calamities e.g. famine, earthquake or droughts
- Human weakness e.g. perverse thoughts

5. (a) What was the importance of circumcision to Abraham and his descendants (7mks)

- It was a sign of obedience and respect to their forefather Abraham
- It is an acceptance to God as their true God and their willingness to remain faithful to Him
- It was a sign of readiness to inherit God's promises to Abraham
- It was a sign of identification of Gods people
- It was an outward budge of their inner faith
- It was a mark of identity for all Jews, the chosen
- It signified purity/cleanliness
- It signified enrolment into the fold of God's people

b) Give similarities between Jewish and African practices of circumcision (8mks)

- In both cases the rite carried out by specialists
- There is giving of gifts in both
- A ceremony normally accompanies the initiation in both
- In both there is shedding of blood which binds the initiates to God or community
- In both the practice took place in sacred places
- In both the practice involves the cutting of the foreskin
- In both cases the ritual is a communal affair
- In both the rite is compulsory for those communities that practice it (passed from one generation to another)
- In both it is practiced in obedience to their customs inherited from their fore fathers/ancestors

c)State reasons why female circumcision is condemned today (5mks)

- It is viewed as unchristian/not founded on Christian principles
- It is seen as mutilation of the body
- It is viewed as a painful process
- It sometimes leads to medical complications
- Some African communities associated to it are detested
- The process is purposeless

6a) Identify seven tasks that God gave to Moses through his call (7mks)

- To deliver the Israelites from slavery in Egypt
- Lead the Israelites to the promised land
- To bring the Israelites to mount Sinai so as to worship God
- To perform miracles and signs in Egypt as a proof that Yahweh was the true God
- To appoint his brother Aaron as his mouthpiece before pharaoh
- To teach the Egyptians and Israelites that Yahweh was the only God to be worshipped

• To make sure the Israelites asked for gold and other jewelries and property from the Egyptians

b) Give eight reasons why Moses was reluctant to God's call to deliver the Israelites (8mks)

- He had killed an Egyptian and ran away
- Moses feared for his death for pharaoh wanted to kill him
- He feared that the Israelites might not believe him
- He was not familiar with the voice of God, name of God/knowledge of God
- He was not fluent in speech (a stammerer)
- He was a sinner having killed an Egyptian
- Moses wanted a proof from God to the Israelites
- He lacked identity/confidence in himself/felt weak as a leader because of his age

c) <u>Mention any five leadership qualities Christians learn from the call of Moses at mt Sinai (5mks)</u>

- Moses was inquisitive Christians should inquire to know the God they are serving
- Moses was obedient/respectful to God-Christians should be obedient
- Moses was humble
- He had wisdom/intelligence
- He was courageous
