



ROLE OF THE HOME SCIENCE TEACHER

The Home Science teacher, in charge of the examination class, will have the responsibility of ensuring a valid assessment in their school. To achieve this, the teacher's duties will involve the following:

- (i) ensuring that professionalism is observed throughout the examination;
- (ii) ensuring that candidates of mixed abilities are arranged in groups of a maximum of ten (10) per session, per teacher, per room;
- (iii) receiving the duplicate order lists for foodstuff and equipment from the supervisor to facilitate compilation of requirements for shopping at the end of the planning session;
- (iv) ensuring that every candidate is supplied with all the requirements for the practical;
- (v) assessing all candidates in the actual practical examination using the marking scheme provided by KNEC;
- (vi) recording the candidate's marks in the manual marksheet in ascending order of index numbers after each session;
- (vii) ensuring that the marking schemes, originals and copies of recipes, order of work and list of foodstuff and equipment for each candidate are stapled together and handed over to the supervisor at the end of every session for safe keeping;
- (viii) ensuring that he/she signs the manual marksheet and then it is signed and stamped by the head teacher and handed over to the supervisor on the last day of the examination;
- (ix) ensuring that the assessment report for the centre is completed and handed over to the supervisor.
